CONTROL

The challenge this spring/summer in the Appleyard-Pekich family is to grow things. Last summer we had one raised bed in the yard which yielded green beans and tomatoes in abundance. This year instead of one raised bed we are going to try to have three. That means lots more tomatoes and a lot more green beans.

The other growing project that we will be partaking in will be trying to grow grass. Last year when the pine trees along the drive between the parsonage and the church came out no grass seed was planted on the inside of the fence. So this year we have put down lime. The kids and I took the time to put up and stake out snow fence to keep the dogs off the seed. And now all we need is rake up the soil, spread the seed, and make sure that the ground stays damp enough, and we will soon have grass, instead of the dust and mud which normally has filled those areas.

Hopefully. We are trying. These are the caveats which I seem to always place before these two statements. You see I look out on the past experiences of Sara and my collective experience gardening and it hasn't been great. And even though I spent six summers professionally caring for grass and almost 30 summers seeding and mowing, experience is never a guarantee of success. There are so many other factors. A few of the wild cards are the dogs, the squirrels, how wet or dry the spring is, the general highs and lows of temperature.

The difficulty with life is that there are the things which we can control, and then there are the things we cannot. We cannot control all the various things which happen each year, each month and each day. There simply are things that happen which are

beyond the limits of our control. The best we can do is manage and control how it is that we respond to those things. When tragedy strikes we can control how it is that we deal with it. When hardship rears its ugly head we cannot control that hardship, but we can control the way in which we rise up to deal with it. It is up to us how we celebrate and ring out with joy.

An Elder at a former church I served always ended his prayers with the same phrase, "We never know what tomorrow holds but we know who holds tomorrow." There is no telling what the next day, week, month or even year truly will have for us. Of course there are certainties, there are things we can count on and estimate happening. But like control there are simply things which will happen which are beyond the realm of what we could have expected. But there is the one who no matter what happens is with us. No matter what occurs whether good or bad, wonderful or awful, we can trust in the certainty that God is with us, that God is holding us.

We might not be able to control the many things which occur in our lives, but we can control whether or not we lean on, or walk with God as we experience them. We can make the choice to face the challenges or successes of the world on our own or with the partnership of God. We can control whether we face the moments that will be on our own or with the King of Kings. As we progress through life and this pandemic may we find strength and support in the arms of Christ.
