#### April 2023

With the weather turning warmer and the flowers starting to poke their heads up from beneath the surface there are certain signs of the change of the season. For me, one of those signs means that the rear of my SUV is filled with lacrosse equipment and folding chairs. While standing at the fields over by Robert Graves Elementary another parent and I marveled at how much bigger the kids were. For the most part we hadn't seen this group of kids playing together since last June, and the size difference was pretty noticeable. Then just the other day I noticed that a pair of pants which Liam had gotten at Christmas had a noticeable gap between the top of the shoe and the bottom of the pantleg.

When I was growing up on the doorframe at my Grandmother's house there were a set of lines with initials on a doorframe. The peak or highest lines for the longest time had S and B on them. Little by little as time wore on the marked moved up the frame. They climbed ever higher and higher until they had reached or had in the case of two of us passed my uncle and Dad's lines. Now depending on how often we visited or how often we asked to be measured depended on how great the leap was from one mark to another. I remember once when I forgot to get measured for almost a year and how my grandparents were shocked by the amount I had grown.

We are winding down the season of Lent and by the time you read this Lent will have ended or have gotten lost in the early stages of Holy Week and Easter. One of the stated goals of the season is to develop a means to grow closer to God. This is normally done by one of the many spiritual disciplines and is a progressive and steady walk by which we develop a closeness with God. In less technical terms it is a time of spiritual growth.

But anytime we talk about growth we find



ourselves standing at that doorframe with a pencil marking off where we are. But can you measure the growth of faith like you measure your height or your weight? Are the yard-sticks or scales which help us to measure where our faith is growing? Unfortunately there is no real easy answer to this.

Instead we look to what Jesus said not necessarily about the growth of faith and its development but what it is likened to and what Jesus says it is like. For me this always tracks back to a mustard seed. It is seemingly one of the tiniest seeds, which gives life to a huge bush which more resembles a tree, in the regions where Jesus walked. Jesus speaks of how powerful faith is even when it is that small, even the tiniest seed can move a mountain.

So do we measure our faith by the mountains we can move? Or do we instead measure them as we measure the growth of a plant. Now If you're one who measures their plants good on you. But for me the growth is something that I don't notice until I do. It isn't something marked on a doorframe but something I know and can trust has occurred. The beauty of this approach isn't in the marks which show growth but the grace that is given. One of the most disheartening things can be when you go and it turns out you haven't grown as much as you wanted. Our faith is something that grows continually especially when we nurture and nourish it. Sometimes the best we can do is just to let it grow. A happy Easter and faith-filled Holy Week to you all. 
