A lot has happened in the last month. And while Easter comes closer, and Lent marches forward lots has happened in the local setting as well as the national and international setting. Just last month I was considering writing something about the Olympics. Our biggest Russian villain was the adults who surrounded a young impressionable skater, and who with her knowing or perhaps not understanding had taken a drug which could help with performance. But then the Ukraine's lands were invaded.

It's has dominated much of our worry cycle, wondering if a world leader who is willing to start such a war and do such horrible things is willing to do what to many of us seems unthinkable. I've heard more discussion in the last few weeks about World War III than I have the rest of my life. It is difficult to read, listen and see all of this play out.

In the midst of all of this there is a profound feeling of powerlessness. When I was a kid and the Desert Shield turned into Desert Storm there was no threat of using nuclear weapons. I remember being told in school how the Iraqi chemical weapons couldn't reach us. Maybe it was naïve of me but after the fall of the Eastern Block and with hunks of the Berlin Wall finding its way all throughout the United States and other countries, I never imagined having to sit my kids down and have to calm their fears of a nuclear war. But here we are.

It is hard as people of faith to watch, listed to or read about the horrors of tragedy. When hurricanes happen, when earthquakes shake, when tornados blow, and wildfires burn, there are things we can tangibly do to meet those tragedies. When a world power invades another and commits unspeakable acts, targeting civilians, hospitals and theaters, it is hard to watch. It becomes harder when we are left to wonder if there is anything



we can do as people of faith.

The simplest and easiest thing which we can do is to pray. Pray for an end to the violence, pray for the civilians, pray for the families which are now torn apart. Prayer is simple, and yet so powerful. On its most basic level is gives us a release for our emotions, fears, worries and everything else which we might have going on inside of us. But we are also taking those prayers to the King of Kings, the Lord our God. We in our prayers are calling on God to help our broken world.

But there are other things we can do as well. You can donate to the Red Cross and other companies who are working to bring aid to refugees. In my own family there are weekly lists shared back and forth of companies which have refused to divest themselves of their holdings in Russia. Has it been difficult getting information about companies which still do business within Russia? Yes it has. Is it hard when a certain company we like makes the decision to not halt operations and so we make the decision to not go there? For some of us it is. Are we making a difference? I hope so.

The reality is that as with other crises that happen our options on what we are able to do as people of faith is only limited by our abilities, comfort level and our imagination. Brothers and Sisters let us meet these crises and tragedies with trust in God and living out of our faith. Amen.
