After the resurrection in Matthew's gospel the disciples travel to Galilee where Jesus meets up with them. He then tells them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." This is commonly called the Great Commission.

As we embrace or work towards embracing growth, we are following our call and commissioning from Christ. We are doing what we have been instructed by Christ, and assisted by the Holy Spirit to do. I'm going to be honest, I do not believe that this is going to be a comfortable journey.
