One of Liam's favorite Christmas songs is titled "the Twelve Pains of Christmas." It comes from a Bob Rivers album from back in the 80's named Twisted Christmas. It's a comedic but also too close to home relating of twelve seemingly unbearable tasks which we place on ourselves during the holidays. From rigging up to the lights, to the tantrums of children, the navigating of family relations, the repercussions of parties, even to the trouble of finding a tree, the tasks both poke fun and speak a bit of uncomfortable truth to us as we make ready for Christmas.

As Advent leads us into Christmas as well as the season of Christmas from a liturgical perspective we are called on to make ready and prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ. In many ways it is sort of like a fire drill preparing us for what to do in case of a fire. However as with so many opportunities to prepare and make ready we don't practice or make ready. Or we don't make as much use of the time that is given, sort of like when you tell one of the kids to clean their room and they sit down with a book instead.

Instead of focusing in, or seeking to become closer to God, we find ourselves busy with perhaps not the 12 pains but at least the 12 different forms of busyness of Christmas. The chaos we create out of tradition or commitments, usually means that our plates are already overflowing by the time we get to the second or third Sunday of Advent let alone by Christmas. There is little or no space for peace on earth and goodwill to all. The call of John the Baptist to prepare and make ready goes in one ear and out the other as we stand in line or hunt for a parking spot.

The act of preparing for Christmas or at least the choices we make in preparing almost need a sort of categorization between what is a choice and what is important. I say that knowing that I have just read

a book speaking about how tradition and the way we have always done things can be a third rail or a bridge too far in ministry. But think about this as you want to push back on that categorization, traditions do have a shelf life in how we celebrate. At some point the gathering place where we would get together to celebrate a holiday with our family is sold because Mom and Dad have passed on or they've moved to a smaller home with less upkeep. Grandma no longer is the only one who makes dinner because she no longer is with you or her hips or knees can't take the standing.

As Advent moves forward and Christmas gets closer take stock of what is or are the most important pieces of celebrating Christ's birth. Make those things a priority, nurture the things of the season like good will, peace and compassion. And if for your own piece/peace of mind you need to make a hard choice about letting something go, or keeping something going, remember the grace of the Lord who's birth we are celebrating and have a sliver of that for yourself.

Christmas isn't about creating chaos and making pain and oppression. It is about how God saw us weighed down and oppressed by sin and death. It is about how God had compassion on us. And to set us free God sent his son, to us. God did so by means of some of the lowliest circumstances and by no simple way. But he did so because of God's deep love for us. May we all find peace, comfort and grace as we make ready for Christmas. May we prepare in a way that doesn't take what little vestiges of energy we have from us, but instead gives us life and relief bevond all measure. Amen.






