Each one wants to add mix, water, eggs, oil, and milk depending on what type of mix we are using. Then each one wants to try and mix it up with the hand whisk. I wish I could say that all of the energy and chaos doesn't wind up with a mess, but.....I can't. Once pancakes are done, and the mess cleaned then the fun really begins. Snowballs, snow forts, snow people (the kids have naming rights), and snow angels lay all around the yard. There is usually a sled track from them being pulled around me getting exhausted. All in all it's a great time, unless it's during the week, then we have to put some of the fun on hold.

A snow day is a great lesson, while as adults we grumble about road conditions or having to scrape or wipe off our cars. We have to shovel or snow blow and salt. We even have added concerns about how old we are and should we shovel. But kids see the snow and cold differently. Where we see work, cold, danger, and frustration, children see a world filled with opportunity and majesty. They are able to find the beauty and possibilities that exist.

And God sees that in each and every one of us. The song "Change my heart oh God," has a verse which is taken from Isaiah 64:8. The verse reads, "we are the clay, you are the potter; we are all the work of your hand." The song reimagines it by singing, "you are the potter, I am the clay, mold me and make me this is what I pray." Just like a potter does with clay, or a child does with snow, God sees in us all of us the various possibilities which can be, God sees in us all that we can and might be at any and every stage and moment of our lives. The difference between us and these images is that when God molds us and shapes us and equips us we have an element of engagement in the process. We can aid it and engage in the process by which God works in our lives.

Brothers and sisters may we see in ourselves and others the same potential that God does, and may we lift up one another along our journey of faith. Amen.


