One of the difficult things in life can be timing. I've been thinking about this quite a bit lately as schedules get busy and it just seems like the time I'm hoping for never seems to come. Sometimes you wait until the right moment for something, such as when your life is in that particular space where you can take on that new task or challenge. Sometimes that moment that you are waiting on just never materializes as you wish that it would. There have been several times when I told myself when the time is right, or when I have some breathing room in life or work, I'll take care of that.

Most recently that happened with a car tire. We had gotten a screw in the driver side front tire. We told ourselves we didn't have time to get it taken care of on that day, so we waited until we had the time. Well the next morning we found the tire flat, completely flat, and I had to attend a meeting at the same time as Sara attending another, so in below freezing temps, I drafted Will to help me to change the tire. Needless to say I wish that we had learned a lesson that day.

Life is filled with moments like this. Moments where we rationalize a measure of procrastination because we are waiting for the "right" time or moment. I've known several colleagues in ministry who had that as a part of their call story. They had sought to attend seminary when the time was right, when chaos was less, or when children were not going through school, or when a spouse had finished their time in school. What often ended up happening is that God had other plans and ideas. I had often wondered about this when I considered my Mom's own journey to seminary since it didn't exactly come at a convenient time in the life of our family, but God doesn't exactly listen when we say not right now.

As we creep towards the start of Lent on February 18th we might have some time-based conversations. Conversations about doing something during that season of the Church Calendar in order to meet the goal of closeness with God. The challenge of the right moment or enough time, or even the idea of when we are ready will crop up in our internal discussions. We might have it on our hearts to do one thing, maybe commit to reading scripture or praying for 30 minutes during Lent. Or we possibly could have the conviction to sit in silence or engage in any of the spiritual disciplines. However as we try to participate in these, what will we say about the time crunch we will be under?

Will we keep it going? Will we argue within ourselves that we just don't have the time to do something this year, or we find that our Lenten discipline is taking too much of our time and so we shorten the time, or drop it all together. If you have committed to doing something this Lent, to grow closer to God, before you shorten your time commitment or even drop it entirely remember this: there is never going to be a time when we feel is right. We will always have a reason why no won't work or why we'll have to dial things back. Consider this are we prepare for Lent. We don't do this for self-gratification or for selfish reasons. It is to deepen faith, to grow it and develop a closer relationship with God, if not now, then when. If not today than when. There is never a time like anytime for us to grow closer to our Lord. Amen
