One of the hardest things for us as we work to serve God in our lives, both as a whole but also in the daily comings and goings of our days is to find balance. Balance is an interesting concept thru and thru. Many of us struggle day to day to find a comfortable work and leisure balance, one in which we both are giving as well as receiving things that give us life. Some of us find that early on, while others might search for it their whole lives.

At a pretty early age we learn the importance of keeping things in balance, from our lives to our bodies. And if we live without that balance, well we will eventually fall over. Think of a child walking or riding a bike. If they are leaning to ner as it always has because there is never a balone direction two things will likely happen. The first is their leaning will eventually get to the point where they land on the ground, or they will over correct and end up tottering and falling over.

Another physical form of imbalance can be when we injure a side of our body. We tend to over work the opposite side. This often leads to strain and issues of over usage on the other side of us. My legs seem to be a pretty good example. In college I broke my foot going to block someone in practice. It was a ridiculous injury that to this day I am not quite sure how I stepped just so. I then overused my left leg and not too long after I tore my left ACL from the imbalance. The imbalance played out years later when I sprained the knee without the ligament which then led me to over compensate and cause a severe sprain of my right ankle.

But the imbalances in life aren't restricted to our physical selves, they can be related to our spiritual selves as well. This really hit hard for me at the last gathering of our classis. It might have seemed innocuous normally but for me it hit really hard. Our denomination is kicking the tires on a restructure and the general consensus is that it isn't

that welcome and that further thought and or planning is needed. However the response to that feed back seems to have been, "We're just the dreamers it isn't for us to put it into place."

This is a constant imbalance we experience as churches and as greater bodies of believers, finding a balance between dreaming and implementation. We have likely seen moments or churches where these two things were imbalance. Where ministries are started and never get off the ground because of a lack of planning and laying of the groundwork. And where ministry continues to happen always in the same way and the same manance which dreams of something different or something more.

Jesus and the disciples provide us a beautiful example of a balanced life of the church. There is a balance between dreaming and doing, between the push of the spirit and getting that push into reality. It is one thing to let God's spirit lead you to a great idea, or opportunity, but we must then put it into action. We also need to remember to let the spirit lead us anew to something that might not be what we always have done, and it might mean listening to a voice we haven't ever listened to before. The hope for the church is in finding a balance, in being balanced, and letting the spirit not just lead us to a dream but putting that dream into action. May the Spirit lead us and guide us and give us the hands to work amen.
