March has been looming. It has been sitting there in our subconscious as the days of March 2021 approached. March 2021 will mark a very hard anniversary for us. One year, it has been one year since Covid-19 was something that was either coming or was on its way.

As I sat down to prepare worship, as I typed the dates, a series of dates began to flood back to me. It was the 8<sup>th</sup> of March when we last worshiped as normal. Having coffee hour, singing in the sanctuary. I even remember the last time I really shook hands with someone. It was at a funeral. Later as we were standing together several of us who were younger took out our phones almost in unison and began reading notifications that the National Guard had been deployed to New Rochelle. Then there was Wednesday the night the NBA stopped when an entire sports league ground to a halt. Then Thursday evening Kingston School District announced that it was cancelling school for Friday. And then Friday we began the state of emergency.

The last year has been many things, traumatic, difficult, hard, sad. Few of us have not had our lives touched by someone we have known, loved or cared about who have lost their lives, had their lives altered or harmed by the virus. We have seen and/or experienced the extreme highs and lows, political, social and generational divisions.

Looking out on this past year from March 2020 to March 2021, can be hard. It is hard not to see the faces of those we have lost over the last year. It is also hard not to see the strain and age on our faces. As I sat writing this the two desks sitting next to me where Liam and Barb have learned at home for a year, are tangible reminders of the strain that this has put one families with children. From the desk I see two aged pieces of crockery, one we received when my

grandmother who somehow at 99 survived the virus although her mind did not, and the other which was a gift from my mother-in-law who was lost back around Thanksgiving.

But through all of this, all that we have endured we haven't only seen strain, division and death. We have seen us learn to pivot, to adjust at a moment and find a way to make things work. We have sought to make the best we can of many things, understanding that times and things are not perfect but can be the best in the moment.

We have also had moments where we were able to see the face of Christ in helping someone, or in being helps ourselves. I remember the joy I saw in people's eyes dropping off meals on Saturday's with Project Resilience. I also remember the tears and support as cards came in offering prayers and condolences when my Mother-in-Law passed.

It has been a difficult year. But I hope that you have been able to see the face of God at some point of it. I hope that through all the difficulty and the struggles you have felt the embrace and love of Christ. As more and more of us are vaccinated and as things hopefully begin to return to a more normal form, may we remember those we have lost and those families who still grieve. May we also remember the good which has happened and the coming together and mutual care we have seen. It has been a dark year, but there have also been beams of light throughout it. There have been times and moments when Christ has shone through the dark.
