We were afraid of conversations where we would have to answer questions about how we were doing all day long, of empty platitudes, or worse someone being out of the loop and asking the question of where he was. The first thing that happened and the only thing that mattered that day was a hug. My grandfather-in-law said nothing, just walked over and hugged me.

The reality it that even with as hard and challenging as this year has been, we still have many things to still be thankful for. Maybe it's a regularly scheduled Face time or zoom call with the grandkids. Or a socially distanced conversation with a close friend which picked you up. Whatever






